

I have used this book several times in class as a case study in agenda-setting. It's a great way to discuss the role of interest groups and social movements in the beginning of the policy process. It is also a good way to introduce students to the women's movement and discuss important issues of sexual harassment that students have or will have to deal with. It stops at Anita Hill, so some updating of the material is necessary, but my classes have had very interesting discussions about appropriate workplace behavior, patriarchy, and power differentials.
